All About Ceremonies

Pioneering Projects (2 hours)

Knots and lashings are an important part of scouting. Pioneering projects are an exciting way to utilize these skills. It takes a lot to plan out a pioneering project, and learn the correct rope skills. This session will help scouts to learn about new lashes, knots, and planning involved in pioneering.

Dance 101

This session will help new and experienced dancers learn and refine dance steps. The basics of costuming will also be covered.

Youth Leadership
