Council of Chiefs
May 21st, 2010
Camp Tuckahoe**



Obligation: The meeting was opened with the Obligation at 11:01 p.m. by Justin Myers.

Minutes: Copies of the minutes from the April Council of Chiefs Meeting were distributed. No changes were noted. The minutes were approved by a motion from Susquehannock, seconded by Tuckahoe.

Lodge Reports:

Kittatinny: Kittatinny Lodge is excited for the rest of conclave. They are looking forward to training and activities tomorrow. At their recent ordeal, they inducted 150 new Ordeal members. Kittatinny also had 40 members help with their council's centennial Scout show.

Susquehannock: Susquehannock Lodge is also excited about conclave. They held a co-LEC meeting with Tuckahoe Friday afternoon. Susquehannock is preparing for a spring fellowship and Brotherhood conversion events at camp.

Wunita Gokhos: Wunita Gokhos Lodge has their spring ordeal the first weekend of June. The lodge is also working on a "Fun Weekend" to be held in October. Camp is coming, and they are looking to increase their involvement this year. Wunita Gokhos can't wait to rock out tomorrow!

Tuckahoe: Tuckahoe Lodge inducted 65 Ordeal members and had 11 Brothers seal their membership at their recent ordeal weekend. They held a co-LEC with Susquehannock before conclave started, and are hoping for a smooth transition into the new lodge.

Old Business:

Conclave:

- a) Training Cells – Kyle Dierolf, Section Vice Chief, held a meeting with tomorrow's trainers before the CoC met. All of them are prepared and have the stickers for their cells. Beadwork is a two-hour session, and can only take 50 people. With 5 lodges, each will be allotted 10 slots for youth. Lodges should survey their members and report to Kyle at breakfast how many slots of their ten they will take. Any extra slots will be filled on a first come, first served basis with youth being preferred to adults. They will actually make a beaded mini-sash.

- b) Service Lodge Report – Alex Bollis, Conclave Chairman, welcomed everyone and said if there were any problems, see him or Brian Kline. Some of the campsites do not have trash cans. There is a dumpster by the dining hall that should be used for those sites. Keep in mind that the rain sites will, most likely, be used this weekend.
- c) Afternoon Activities – Josh Peloquin, Section Secretary, passed out the stickers for the Saturday afternoon activities. A question was raised about the Lodge Adviser Cook-off. The location is behind the dining hall, in the staff site. The lodges should set up at whichever fire circle they choose. Questions relating to space should be directed at Jeff Richter, Tuckahoe Lodge Adviser. Tuckahoe, Susquehannock, Kittatinny, and Wunita Gokhos will be competing, and will be judged in that order. The competition will start at 11:50 AM, and judging will begin at 3:30 PM, running in 15 minute intervals. There will be five judges this year. The categories are best entrée, best dessert, and best presentation. Stickers for the activities should be passed out after people spend a little time at the station. The times that activities will be running are in the booklet. Susquehannock will coordinate times for the volleyball competition. The Brotherhood ceremony competition will commence directly after the finish of Pre-Ordeal. Ceremonies judges will be eating lunch together Saturday afternoon. The ceremonies competitions will be held at the circle, which is marked on the map. Signs will also be posted tomorrow with directions.
- d) Saturday Night Activities – Josh Peloquin passed out the punches and cards for the games. Lodges were reminded to have the punch at the game table, and that the location might be changed to the dining hall, pending the weather.
- e) Gifts – Justin Myers, Section Chief, reminded the lodges that their \$50 raffle gifts need to be given to Bob by Saturday night.
- f) Rock Band Competition – Alex Bollis asked for the number of competing bands. Practice will be in 20 minute intervals starting Saturday afternoon.
- g) Patch Donations – The donation box is currently in the administration building, but may be moved to the trading post. Remember that you get a sticker if you donate!

New Business:

Officer Nominations: Kevin Myers and Josh Peloquin were nominated for the position of Section Chief. Derrick Bransby and Brett Mauser were nominated for the position of Section Vice Chief. Nominations will not close until just before the election.
