Obligation: The meeting was opened with the Obligation at 11:17 p.m. by Justin Myers.

Minutes: Copies of the minutes from the April Council of Chiefs Meeting were distributed. No changes were noted. The minutes were approved by a motion from Susquehannock, seconded by Kittatinny.

Lodge Reports:

Kittatinny: Kittatinny Lodge would like to thank Octoraro for a great Friday night. They really appreciate all of the work you put into conclave. During Kittatinny's spring ordeals, in April and May, they inducted about 180 new Ordeal members, with 52 sealing their membership in the Brotherhood. They have 26 members attending NOAC: 18 youth and 8 adults. Around \$5,000 has been raised to help offset the price of attendance. Kittatinny is also getting ready for summer camp.

Susquehannock: Susquehannock Lodge held their May Ordeal two weekends ago, where they inducted 62 Ordeal members and 5 Brotherhood members. They are preparing for a Lodge Picnic in July.

Octoraro: Octoraro Lodge would like to thank everyone for coming this weekend. Let them know if there are any problems, and they will be happy to fix them. They recently completed work on their Lodge building. Go check it out! Octoraro has been focusing on conclave preparations recently.

Wunita Gokhos: Since the last meeting, Wunita Gokhos Lodge held their Spring Fellowship, as well as their Spring Ordeal. At the ordeal, they inducted 36 Ordeal members, 5 members attained Brotherhood membership, and 5 completed their Vigil. They are currently prepping for their summer camp activities, and are really looking forward to conclave!
